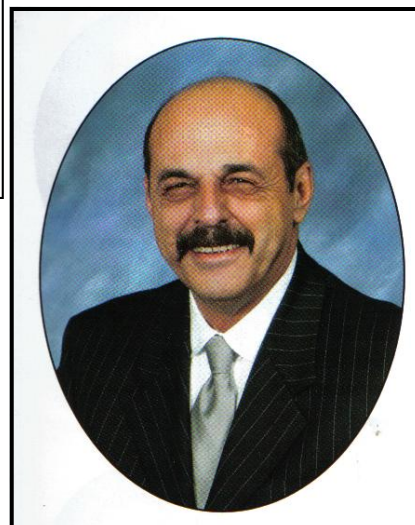

Let me remind you how the Pen Drop Project works. It's really quite simple. Pick up a few pens and carry them with you. When you go out to eat, leave a pen with your tip. It carries the message "God loves you – and we do too!" along with the church name, address and phone number. Who knows what God will do with a message like that?

Would you like to help fund this project? Pray about it and see where God leads you. For your information, we were able to get the second thousand pens for just under \$230.00. Of course, this thousand should last several months.

We are supposed to be in winter but as I write this I'm not certain what the season is. The only proof so far that I have that it is winter is that the youth went on the third annual ski trip to Winterplace West Virginia. Twenty one adults and youth left for West Vir-

ginia on Friday, January 13 in four different vehicles. These four vehicles were need because of the number of people and luggage. I'm not sure how an unmentioned 15 year old youth, Coye, could pack so much but I am certain she left nothing in her parent's house when she left. I had to put a C-41 transport on hold just in case, ok, ok I do exaggerate a little, not much, but you would not read this if I didn't. The skinning was decent, there was new snow the weekend before we arrived and there was even snow in Richmond during that weekend. One of the neat things about being in youth ministry is that I get to see other peoples kids grow in many ways. One of those is in activities like this ski trip. As mentioned earlier, this is the third ski trip Unity youth have been on since my family arrived at Unity. I have seen a few of these that had never seen skis grow into very accomplished skiers; Scarlett, Drew and Clay are three that quickly come to mind. Unity Baptist church, you are the leaders, the ministers that are responsible for disciplining these youth and babes in Christ. Discipleship and evangelism are important things that we need to be focused on. God commands that we make disciples of others, discipleship requires building a relationship between older and younger Christians, It's more than teaching, it's guiding, directing and preparing the disciple to do the ministry, that's what Christ did during His time on this earth.

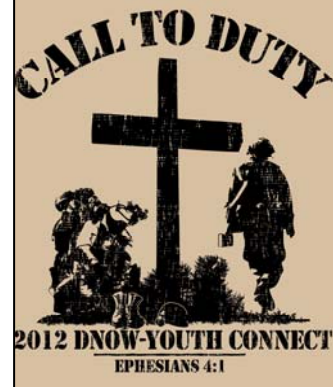

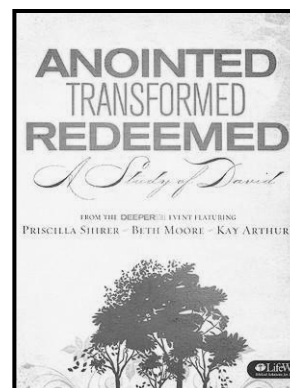

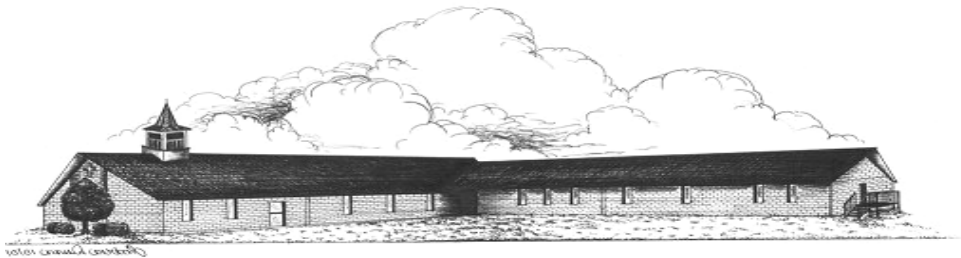
